- be forward-looking in gospel mission locally, and in solidarity with Anglicans throughout the world, especially those suffering through poverty or discrimination.
- outline the doctrinal basis of authentically Anglican churches and the global nature of confessional Anglicanism
- demonstrate public support for the Anglican Church in North America.
- focus on mission faithful to the biblical gospel in a society being targeted by aggressive secularism.
- spell out the kind of ministries that Confessing Anglicans as a movement will promote and stand behind with examples of church planting, training of men and women for ministry, godly and proper use of resources for ministry, evangelism, and godly Biblical oversight.

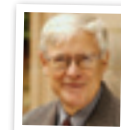

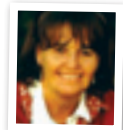

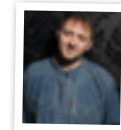
