The General Secretary of the Global Fellowship of Confessing Anglicans and one of the key organisers of GAFCON 2013, Archbishop Peter Jensen, says the group stands in solidarity with Kenyans after the terrifying events of the Westgate attack. Dr Jensen and Bishop Martyn Minns visited Nairobi this week as final preparations are being for the start on Oct 21st. In a [video](#) to delegates, Dr Jensen expressed sympathy to the nation of Kenya for what he called 'these tragic and horrible events'. Quoting John 3:16, Dr Jensen said "However
