Nairobi 2013: Africa meeting casts a wider net

More delegates from continental Europe and the first delegates from the Pacific Islands are expected to join the Nairobi conference, the first major GAFCON meeting since Jerusalem 2008. The Jerusalem meeting was a landmark in the recent history of the Anglican Communion. Delegates came from Asia, Africa, the UK, US and Australia. A meeting of key leaders in London in 2012, together with the regular gatherings of the GAFCON/GFCA Primates Council, laid the groundwork for the gathering planned for

Nairobi's All Saints Cathedral and Conference Centre from 21st to 26th October. Travel arrangements are now being made for the delegates who will come from further afield than in 2008, and include Archbishops, Bishops and clergy as well as key lay leaders and representatives of Anglican organisations from across the world.
